Update on The Almohammed Family

Ibrahim and Fazwah and their four children are moving on July 1 to California to live with a cousin. St. Michael's has been supporting this family since their arrival in February when a delegation of parishioners

met them at the airport and transported them to their new home, an apartment thoughtfully furnished and set up by many St. Michael's volunteers. Donations of food, clothing, gift cards, time, and rent assistance have poured in over the past five months. Working through Refugee Services of Texas, Ibrahim found a job and they received social services to meet their special needs. Parishioners formed warm bonds with the family through shared meals, shopping trips, aiding in school enrollment, driving to appointments, and teaching English.
