Rector Search Update - Update to our Mission, Vision and Core Values - On July 8, members of the Vestry, Profile Committee and ministry leaders met for a Leadership Workshop to review St. Michael's Mission, Vision and Core Values. The Rev. Francene Young, the Diocese Transition Officer and Elizabeth Ann Gates, a congregational consultant reviewed the survey assessment results and facilitated discussion with this group to guide them in drafting new Mission, Vision and Core Values statements. These drafts were shared with the attendees at the Congregational Meeting on July 16. Rev. Young and Mrs. Gates also facilitated this meeting where attendees shared their vision of St. Michael's in five years.

Following the Congregational meeting, a small group consisting of several Vestry and non-Vestry members reviewed the draft statements to make sure they reflected the comments from the Congregational Meeting. They recommended a final draft to Vestry. Vestry approved a new Mission, Vision and Core Values on July 28.
