**Chalking the Door: "Holy Graffiti" for Epiphany and the New Year!** Here's a light-hearted new tradition for families of all kinds to begin the new year. From the Epiphany and continuing for days to come, more and more Episcopalians are joining other Christians around the world in writing this ancient yet ever-changing formula on their doors: 20+C+M+B+23.

The numbers, letters and symbols have been called "holy graffiti," and some people suggest the combination looks like the start of an algebraic equation.

"Chalking the door," as it is known, is seen as invoking Christ's blessing not only on the physical house but on the people who live there and those who visit. There is a long tradition of blessing homes, especially on the Epiphany, which falls on Jan. 6 each year, and the weeks that follow. Europeans have chalked their doors as part of Epiphany house blessings for centuries, especially Roman Catholics. The practice has become popular in the United States only relatively recently. Chalking can be done simply with a short prayer or with songs, prayers, processions, incense and holy water. Clergy or laypeople can do the chalking. —adapted from an Episcopal News Service article by Christine Havens, Director of Communication

### The Blessing of a Home at Epiphany Chalking the Door: "Holy Graffiti"

#### INSTRUCTIONS

Using a piece of chalk, mark the lintel of your front door (or front porch step) as follows:

20 + C + M + B + 23

Those gathered pray during the chalking:

Leader God shall watch over your going out and your coming in.

Response From this time forth for ever more.

#### All pray

0 God of and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Light of the nations and the Glory of your people, bless those who dwell in this house. May it be for them a place of peace and health, that they may rejoice in the gifts and graces you have bestowed upon them and dedicate their talents for the good of those for whom your Christ came and gave his life, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

The letters in the "formula" are the abbreviation for the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" - "Christ bless this house" (A second meaning and mnemonic device is Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar traditional names for the Magi). The + signs represent the cross, and the 20 and 23 are the year.

**Confirmation Invitation** St. Michael's is looking forward to welcoming Bishop Kai Ryan, who will join us at St. Michael's on Sunday, March 26, 2023, at which time she will confirm and receive youth and adults as part of her visitation to our parish. Confirmation is a sacramental rite of the Church, in which the Bishop lays hands on a person as she or he affirms their faith in Christ and their commitment to the Church.

For those already confirmed in a different apostolic tradition (for instance, in the Catholic church), the Bishop also "receives" new members into the Episcopal Church. Practically speaking, this is how one officially joins the Episcopal Church.

I wanted to let you know that I am planning a sabbatical for the summer of 2024. Taking an extended time of rest and renewal every six to seven years is strongly encouraged by the Diocese of Texas, as there is ample evidence to suggest that this will benefit both the congregation and pastor.
