Dear St. Michael's family,


In the blink of a few days, we have crossed from Christmas season into Epiphany. We've traveled all the way from the manger to the river, where this Sunday, the first after THE Epiphany celebrated on January 6, we are witness to Matthew's account of John baptizing Jesus. Not only that, but we have another little epiphany, which means "appearance" in Greek, of "the Spirit of God descending like a dove" to announce that Jesus is his son, "the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." I don't think that the passage gives an adequate visual of the experience, nor any indication of John's reaction and what any others present might have felt. Is there an answer to the question, "why was Jesus baptized?" Looking at the wide array of artwork from the past and from the present, such as the one to the right from the 15th-century Très Riches Heures a book of Hours, of the Duc de Berry, can be an illuminating experience but yet still leave much to wonder about.

Let's backtrack a moment, all the way to last year, and the baptisms of Aidan and Avery, children of Josh Sawyer and Shea Hillis-Sawyer, on December 29. What do these lovely photographs have to show us about baptism? Do they share something in common with the medieval image of Jesus, John, and the Trinity? What can you see here that might relate not only to what Jesus experienced, but what a Christian community, such as St. Michael's, might experience and what have you experienced as a beloved child of God?

I'm not sure I have any solid answers; I can only reflect on the nature of the epiphanies that happen in my life in this season, and in every season, when taking the time to spend with scripture and in community and fellowship with those who follow Christ.
