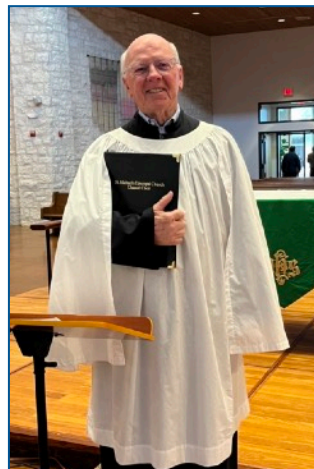
STAFF TRANSITIONS AND CELEBRATIONS

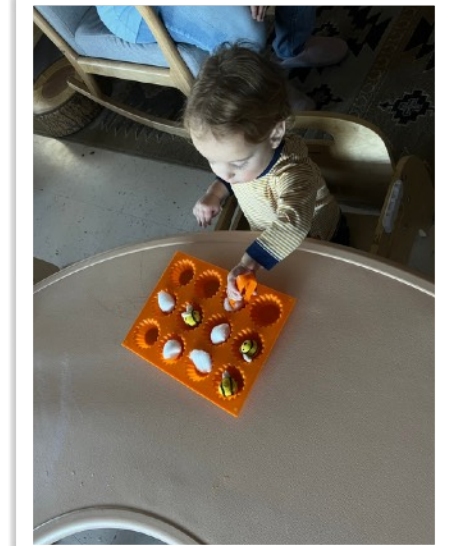
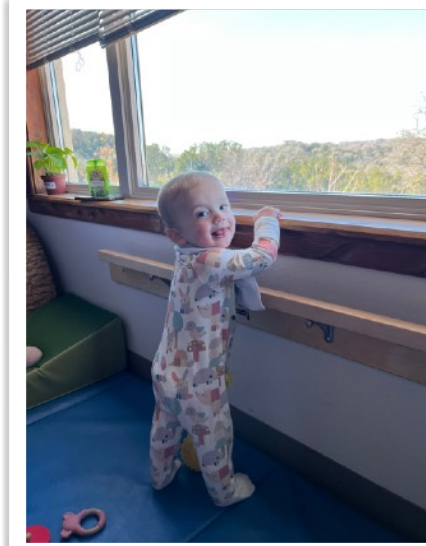
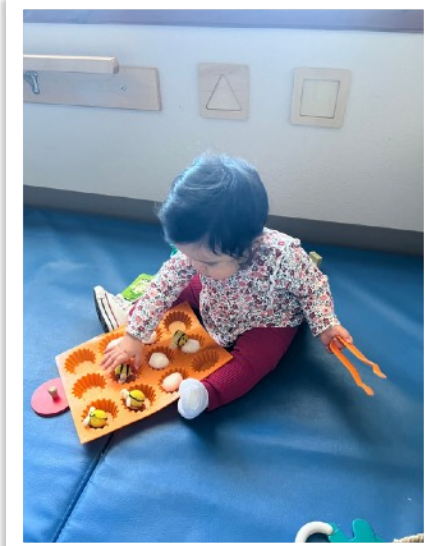
