Confirmation, Membership, and Joining the Episcopal Church We are looking forward to having Bishop Kai Ryan join us at St. Michael's on Sunday, April 7, at which time she will confirm and receive youth and adults at our 11:00 am service as part of her visit.

Confirmation is a sacramental rite of the Church, in which the bishop lays hands on a person as they affirm their faith in Christ and their commitment to the bhurch. For those already confirmed in a different tradition (for instance, in the Roman Catholic Church), the bishop also "receives" new members into the Episcopal Church. Practically speaking, this is how one officially joins the Episcopal Church.

Confirmation classes for youth 7th grade and up will start this Sunday between services at 10:00 am, led by Hope Benko. We already have a great group signed up, but it is never too late to join. Just send Hope an email at hope@st-michaels.org.

Likewise, if you're an adult and have been attending St. Michael's for a while but were either never confirmed or received into the Episcopal church, well, it's time to make it official! Email Fr. 
