

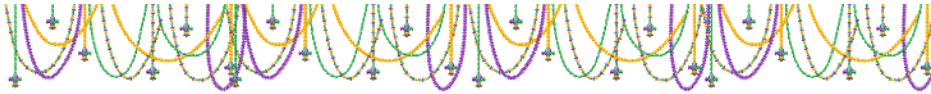

## **Participate in Lent Madness with Fr. Josh & Christine | Begins Thursday, February 23**

A fun and educational spiritual practice, Lent Madness began in 2010 as the brainchild of the Rev. Tim Schenck. In seeking a fun, engaging way for people to learn about the men and women comprising the Church's Calendar of Saints, Tim came up with this unique Lenten devotion. Combining his love of sports with his passion for the lives of the saints, Lent Madness was born.

The format is straightforward: 32 saints are placed into a tournament-like single elimination bracket. Each pairing remains open for a set period of time and people vote for their favorite saint. 16 saints make it to the Round of the Saintly Sixteen; eight advance to the Round of the Elate Eight; four make it to the Faithful Four; two to the Championship; and the winner is awarded the coveted Golden Halo. The first round consists of basic biographical information about each of the 32 saints. Things get a bit more interesting in the subsequent rounds as the celebrity bloggers offer quotes and quirks, explore legends, and even move into the area of saintly kitsch.

*About the Trinity Center worship service:* On Sunday afternoon, the Trinity Center acts as the church for people experiencing homelessness with a service that is offered alternately by different churches and is followed with a meal. Many of the neighbors do not feel welcome in the regular Sunday services in town. By setting up the center as a communal place to worship, with a service, music, meal and a collaboration with other spiritual services' providers we "walk the walk" of loving our neighbors as ourselves. There are usually 30-40 people who come to Sunday services.
