**The Rev. Dr. David Wilhite** is Professor of Historical Theology at Baylor University's Truett seminary, and he specializes in early Christianity. He is also an ordained Baptist minister and has served several congregations on staff and as interim pastor. David is married to Amber, and they have to kids in college. The title of his talk is "Lent as a Journey: Lessons from Ancient Pilgrimage." He will be looking at the earliest sources on Christian pilgrimages to Jerusalem, which usually coincided with Lent and Holy Week, and talk about how this later developed into the Stations of the Cross.
