JUNIOR WARDEN'S RESTORATION UPDATE FROM KRISTEN LECLAIR: "Everyone's care and concern regarding the building damage caused by the recent winter storm is greatly appreciated. We were fortunate to have the cleanup and water damage mitigated right away; the extent of the damage continues to be evaluated by our insurance and construction specialists. Unfortunately, careful inspection thus far has revealed further damage than originally expected. At this time, the comprehensive list for full restoration is not complete, but we are hopeful to have a fully defined plan and timeline in the next few weeks. Updates will be shared as available. It's notable that while the storm damage was not a pleasant surprise, the timing for repairs while COVID has already necessitated remote worship is a small silver lining. Additionally, the pre-planned and current project to repair our roof has continued uninterrupted. These opportunities will allow us to refresh and renew our beautiful church, and make our return to in-person services even more joyful. Thank you for your continued prayers."


