2024 Texas Pauli Murray Scholarship Gala

St. Michael's has been a foundational supporter of the scholarship since its inception as part of our outreach ministry. This year's reception on February 29 in Houston was attended by Fr. Josh, Rev. Hope, our seminarian Scott Madison (who is a Pauli Murray Scholar), Nancy Springer-Baldwin, and Lee Crawford. The scholarship is an endowed fund that supports students of color attending the Seminary of the Southwest; it's named for the Rev. Pauli Murray, a 20th century civil rights advocate, attorney, poet, author, and the first African-American woman ordained as a priest in the Episcopal Church.
