"Born to bring order to ecclesiastical chaos, Michael Reeves taught in Asia, Africa, Central and South America, Europe, and at St Michael's. Extraordinarily ecumenical and inclusive, grandfather of 4, still with his first love after 50 years." This was Michael's bio on the St. Michael's website. As with each of us, a few words can give an impression, but rarely do they encapsulate the day-to-day encounters that happen in a



lifetime, let alone during three years of time at a job. Each day in the office, Michael's pastoral presence made an impact on staff as well as vendors and parishioners. His devotion to Mary, his wife, showed in the special 50th anniversary party he planned. The poems he'd written for her over the years took pride of place.

Speaking for myself, Michael helped me to feel at home as a new member of the SMEC staff last year. His generosity and wisdom filled the office, and I loved hearing stories about his life, past and present.

Glimpses of Grace by The Rev. Elizabeth Turner

Grace need not be prayed for; grace needs only to be recognized. Sometimes at best we get glimpses of grace. On Ash Wednesday, while I was still considering my Lenten discipline, I read an article by Margaret Renkl in which she wrote, "For Lent, I'm planning to make a heartfelt offering. . .to seek out daily causes for praise rather than daily reminders of lack." Renkl resolved to daily notice "tiny beautiful things." Or perhaps to rephrase it, where are we daily given glimpses of grace even as we are mandated to shelter in place. One friend of mine is posting a daily photo of a "bit of beauty" that she sees on her daily dog walk. There are glimpses of grace in the recognition that we continue to be the church even though we cannot gather in person as the church. We see glimpses of grace in the not-to-be-taken-for-granted waking up in the morning. We see glimpses of grace in the tears of the overwhelmed. This is what some call the practice of gratitude.

As we approach Easter, we will be reminded again of the power and reality of grace in the gift of our resurrected Lord. Pope Francis recently said, "In the midst of isolation . . . we experience the loss of so many things but let us once again listen to the proclamation that saves us: He is risen and is living by our side." This is the grace of God.
