Grace in the Opposites: Thoughts for the Second Sunday of Easter by Sally Lombardo

I've been thinking a lot during these suspended days about how God's grace endures despite interruptions in its very practical, tangible way. Such contrasts can help bring truth to light. Although normal activity has stopped, things which occur by God's grace-love, friendship, caring for othershave not. In the midst of sorrow and loneliness, beauty remains unchanged, and such grace can save us from despair. Though we are staying in place, birds are unaware of a pandemic and dart blithely about with abandon. We may find ourselves tired and unmotivated, but flowers are still bursting with color, bringing light to the soul. Though many are sick, the words of Jesus endure in their healing way. Maybe this is why Paul recounts God's words-"My grace is sufficient for you"-since it truly is. Despite our anxious concerns, beauty and calm prevail. The bluebonnets still bloom along a favorite path, and Easter Sunday arrived in our homes without fanfare or haste. At my outdoor place of prayer, a hummingbird hovers at an extravagant pink flower, reaching inside. 'If you will search deeply, there is much to learn.' I have seen grace at work in the tension of opposites; Jesus Himself gently healed the ear of the slave at Gethsemane during the dark night of His soul. Out of darkness, life.
