You may have noticed that St. Michael's recently switched from using wafers at communion to using loaves of bread, which are baked by our baking crew. What you may not have noticed is that the patens and chalices (plates and cups) being used to serve that bread and the wine have also been switched from the silver ones we had been using. These were made especially for SMEC in 2008 by Harold Littlebird, of the Laguna Pueblo people. Thanks to the Altar Guild and Chris Pencis, head of the bread baking crew for helping us take a closer look.

Much prayer and meditation influenced the making of these sacred objects. God was allowed to speak and guide.

The Chalices are "The Book of John" chalices. Different passages from scripture taken from the book of John are cited on each chalice stem. Some are easily recognized and some are harder to read. The chalices are deliberately imperfect because we are imperfect. Only God is perfect. Seams on the bowl of chalices are signs of the stipes he bore for our sins. You may also notice different imprints that represent the trinity.

The Patens/plates bear the sign of the cross and they represent male and female sacredness. Many of the motifs are taken from my own native traditions and spiritual path. As a Christian I listened for the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.
