GLIMPSES OF GRACE

Thoughts for the Seventh Sunday of Easter by the Rev. Elizabeth Turner

A friend posted on Facebook this week that another friend of hers told her that she has been using her lock-down time to finally read *War and Peace*. . . in French and Russian. My friend responded by saying, "Two can play at that game: I'm clearing out my email inbox." The growing stack of unread books at the foot of my bed (including Dante's *The Divine Comedy*) point to aspirations for "lockdown" that resonate with setting a goal to read (again) *War and Peace* (albeit only in English) but point instead to accomplishments more similar to that of clearing out an email inbox. Once orders to shelter-in-place were mandated, there seemed to be optimism about how manageable it was all going to be. We could have our groceries delivered to our homes, parents of school age children had well constructed daily schedules for school work and enrichment, we would organize our lives, Marie Kondo-ize our homes, and read stacks and stacks of books.

We seemed to have thought that there was going to be a perfect way to be quarantined. . .as long as we had a plentiful supply of toilet paper. But instead, I suspect that I am not alone in being reminded, once again, of the impossibility of perfection. I have more than *glimpsed* the grace of imperfection—it has stared me daily in the face. When our daughter was born, one of her godmothers, the Jungian analyst and author Ann Ulanov, told me not to expect to be a perfect mother. Instead she wisely said, what we can be is "good enough." This is the grace of imperfection: it is sufficient to be "good enough." God's grace is what is sufficient!

THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CHURCHES WILL HOLD A PUBLIC ONLINE MEMORIAL SERVICE ON SUNDAY, MAY 24, AT 6:00 PM ET to mourn the more than 300,000 people worldwide who have lost their lives to the COVID-19 pandemic, more than 90,000 of whom were in the United States. This service, **A Time to Mourn: An Ecumenical Memorial Service for Lives Lost to COVID19**, will be broadcast on YouTube and Facebook Live. The NCC is comprised of 38 member communions ranging from mainline Protestant to historic African American and Orthodox churches.
