EXTRAVAGANT GENEROSITY: SUSIE ORUM, OUTREACH COMMISSION CHAIR

St. Michael's Episcopal Church is a very active community whose parishioners take the idea of extravagant generosity and find a plentitude of ways in which to express it. Susie Orum, our Outreach Commission chair, is one such example.

In May, Susie's voice was heard by many, including the *Austin Monitor*. While in a meeting with Commissioner Daugherty along with Mother Minerva and others of Central Texas Interfaith (CTI), the commissioner asked for her telephone number to follow up on an important point she made about rental assistance only being available annually. She was then asked by county staff to testify at the county commissioners court.

Her work on behalf of those who are in financial crisis due to the COVID-19 pandemic was instrumental in convincing Travis County to provide \$40 million in rental assistance. She presented a strong case for the larger amount, but then encouraged the county to pass the \$10 million, which they did.

Susie has been involved with St. Michael's for much of her adult life. She came to the church in 1968 while she was a student at UT. She says, "It was love



at first sight." After some time away, she returned in 1980 with her now-deceased husband, Mark Jorjorian, who was briefly the rector of St. Michael's. After living in Chicago for 30 years, she returned in 2015 and has been with SMEC ever since. Besides her work with CTI, Susie loves working in the SM garden, welcoming refugee families, serving on the Outreach Commission, and being in the Altar Guild. What brings her the most joy are the people at St. Michael's.

GLIMPSES OF GRACE

Thoughts for Trinity Sunday by Sally Lombardo, MDiv

In thinking about how to focus on grace, I couldn't help but stay with the pandemic and the riots. Most of us are wondering who's in charge here, and if God is still in control. The apostle Paul recognizes God's sovereignty quite often. To keep him from being proud, writes Paul, God placed a thorn in his flesh to torment him, all the while assuring him, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Cor 12:9). The theme of God's grace through our weakness runs through the Word. In Numbers, God graces his wandering Israelites with the priesthood, and the sons of Aaron will inherit the "priestly portion due them in perpetuity." Manna was grace; as described in Psalms of Lament, the long-suffering of the Lord is his grace; Job confesses that "If it were God's intention, and He withdrew his spirit, all humanity would perish together" (34:14-15). In our current trial, God's protection and grace still abound in his mercy and provision. I recently heard a bit of wisdom from NT Wright: Through all this pestilence and unrest, God may be calling us to lament. According to the psalmist, we cry, "Not to us, Lord, but to your name give glory, for the sake of your steadfast love, why should the nations ever ask, 'Where is their God?' (Ps 115:1-2). Maybe in this dim time, grace abides in our willingness to lament and to see God's mercy.
