



BRAVE WOMEN OF THE EARLY CHURCH: A NEW ADULT FORMATION CLASS

Sally Lombardo is passionate about the women of the early church, so much so that while in seminary, she decided to write a book about them. She's now going to share her insights into these brave souls with St. Michael's by teaching a three-week class in July.

The class, which consists of a video lesson sent in our Sunday email, followed by a Zoom discussion on Wednesday evenings, was inspired when Sally "began to see how women had not only shaped the message of the Bible, but had been instrumental in guarding the fledgling church." Her later work as a doula and midwife further encouraged her to seek a way to share their wisdom with others. She crafted Brave Women of the Early





their stories with those of contemporary women in her own life.

She's adapted her soon-to-be published book for this class, presenting Mary Magdalene, Lydia, Priscilla, Chloe, Phoebe, Junia, and Nympha to us and providing space in which to consider how much their courage and strength shaped the early church and how we might use them as examples in our own faith journeys today.

Sample questions to pique your curiosity include "How are we called to be 'midwives' of the faith today?" and "What is our purpose as those who 'bring the kingdom' of God?" The questions, based on the lessons, will be included in each Sunday email as well as the Zoom link. The Zoom info will also be in next week's Trumpet; no need to pre-register.

Sally is currently studying for her PhD at Baylor, where she also received her

Master of Divinity degree at Truett Seminary. She also has a Master's in English and a certificate in spiritual direction. She's been writing some great Glimpses of Grace meditations in the Trumpet.

Thoughts for the Fourth Sunday after Pentecost by Amanda Evans Lang, Family Minister


