# Thoughts for the Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost by the Rev. Minerva Camarena Skeith

Three months ago, Samuel, my older son, convinced us to accept free chicks offered by his teacher. Every year Mr. Harper has his students build an incubator. During "regular" school the project and the school year end with chicks hatching and the students adopting a chick. However, as we all know, this was no "regular" school year. Mr. Harper ended up with a garage filled with chicks. He sent out an email to all his students pleading them to come and pick up as many chicks as their parents would allow.

We brought home three. Felix is the lone survivor. I have to admit that I did not think chickens were a good idea. I thought the last thing we needed during this pandemic is to have more things to worry about and take care of. However, Felix has provided unexpected moments of grace for our family. I have enjoyed watching my son and my father care for this chicken. Grandfather and grandson have spent hours trying to figure out how to best care for Felix. They worked closely to build a chicken coop when Felix had outgrown her plastic bin in the garage. They take turns feeding the chicken. My father takes the morning shift—Samuel is not an early riser. I love watching my father sit outside drinking his coffee. My father and Felix have mastered the art of reducing the fly population in our backyard. Samuel has the afternoon shift. He goes outside, lets Felix out of her coop, changes her water and hangs out. He has another living creature to interact with during this time of isolation. He comes back from his visits with Felix renewed.

Felix has provided all of us an opportunity to see one of God's creatures grow and develop. She has become part of our family. When Samuel first asked us if he could have some chickens, I could only see the cost it would be to add another living creature to our family. I had no idea that this feathery creature would bring laughs, discovery, and create good memories that we will remember forever.
