




FALL FORMATION PROGRAMMING FOR ALL AGES RESUMES SOON! YAY!

GLIMPSES OF GRACE

Thoughts for the Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost by Luis Rivas, Youth Minister

If I were to ask you who is the most influential Christian author in the last hundred years or so, one of your top choices might be C.S. Lewis. Lewis wrote with a perfect balance of a high view of creation, appreciation of mystery, nuanced spirituality, creedal orthodoxy, evangelical zeal, and accessible language (to his contemporary readers, at least) that has endeared him to Christians from every tradition.

I have been delighted to rediscover his works. Perhaps due to the current circumstances of the world, I noticed a recurring theme of characters struggling with slipping away from the faith during difficult times or because of the worries of daily living. Characters like (spoiler alert!) Susan in the later Chronicles of Narnia books, Ransom at the beginning of *Out of the Silent Planet*, or the Patient in *The Screwtape Letters*, show that Lewis was no stranger to the concept of life being an obstacle to a vibrant faith sometimes. He was, however, always optimistic that all it took was an encounter with something, or rather, Someone, larger than ourselves, along with a little bit of humility, to make even the most mundane of people into a hero of the faith. I feel comforted by the idea that someone I look up to so much felt the same way I currently do, and it is an encouraging reminder to keep reaching out to God even when I don't feel like doing so; perhaps especially when I don't feel like doing so.


