SMEC AND SSW: GOOD NEWS IN ABUNDANCE

Earlier this year, the Seminary of the Southwest kicked off the public phase of their Forming Leaders at the Frontier campaign, inviting the people of The Episcopal Church to invest in SSW's future and that of the future church leaders. *Thanks to your extravagant generosity,* St. Michael's is donating \$15,000 to this effort, in acknowledgement of the ways, large and small, that our community is linked with that of SSW and all the ways in which the Gospel Meets the World through the ministry of this remarkable place. To quote John Bennet Waters, "It is a fabulous institution that makes many good waves in the Episcopal Church today."

There's definitely not enough room here to detail all these connections, such as the work Lee Crawford and other parishioners did to help establish the Pauli Murray scholarship for people of color, or to share the leadership SSW is taking with expansion of the Iona Institute in training people for the work ahead. We have quite a few alums, both students and former SSW staff, in our parish, and we are honored to shine a little spotlight on them (please forgive if we've omitted anyone).

THE REV. HOPE BENKO has worked as the Director of Enrollment Management and Admissions for the seminary since June 2016. She particularly loves listening to new students describe how God has led them to Southwest.

DONNA EMERY joined the Institutional Advancement team in August 2020. Her focus is on building relationships to further the mission of the Seminary. and she is grateful to the St. Michaels community for embracing the campus improvements necessary to recruit and develop future leaders of the Church.

CHRISTINE HAVENS graduated with an MA in Religion in 2014, helping to found *Soul by Southwest*, the literary journal. She knew she was home the moment she set foot on the SSW campus.

JOEL MCALISTER is the SMEC seminarian. He has been studying at the Seminary of the Southwest in order to receive a Masters of Divinity. He has completed 2 years of study and is currently in his third and final year.

THE REV. MINERVA CAMARENA SKEITH graduated from SSW in May 2019 with an MDiv. degree. SSW's amazing faculty and staff provide an enriching environment that allows every student to identify their gifts that will serve their ministry.

NANCY SPRINGER-BALDWIN lead the development office and then the communications office at the seminary after she earned an MA in Religion in 1986.

THE REV. PHILIP TURNER was twice employed by SSW: as Professor of Christian Ethics from 1975-1980 and again as Interim Dean from 2005-2007.

JOHN BENNETT WATERS served the Seminary of the Southwest for 15 years as Vice President of Administration and Finance. He watched SSW grow with four deans and vibrant staff and faculty while nurturing and forming not only clergy but counselors and chaplains to serve the church and the world.


SUNDAY SCHOOL & EYC
