Serve on the SMEC Vestry The St. Michael's vestry (akin to an organization's board) has the role of tending to the financial and organizational health of the church. All adult members of St. Michael's who have been confirmed/received and have been regularly attending worship during the past year are eligible for consideration. Qualification for serving on vestry is based on the canons of the church, as well as alignment with the core values we have for our leadership. Vestry members are elected to a three-year term at our annual parish meeting in January.

Church-Related Phishing Scams on the Rise In the past year, St. Michael's has sent out email warnings of phishing scams from thieves purporting to be from Fr. John at least once a month. These emails share similarities —Fr. John needs a "favor" but he is unavailable for some reason and asks you to contact him or ask you to send a gift card of some sort. With stewardship season here, it's important to be aware that none of our clergy would approach parishioners in this manner or ask for gift cards. Even though AARP's membership is older folks, their website has a robust Scams & Fraud section that can help improve anyone's digital literacy and cybersecurity.


PLUG INTO ()UTREACH


