#### **EXTRAVAGANT GENEROSITY AT SMEC**

This letter from the Central Texas Food Bank arrived in the SMEC mailbox over the weekend. It serves as testimony to the extravagant generosity our community has continued to practice "during this critical time," to quote Mr. Derrick Chubbs, President & CEO of the organization. He goes on to thank us for our "generous donation" of nearly \$1600, saying that this gift will enable the Food Bank to provide "healthy food options," especially for programs such as the Kids Café. Children will "receive 5 dinners and 5 snacks each week," that are "generally made from scratch." Our donation "helps ensure that the [Food Bank] can keep these children fed and prepared for a new school year."

This donation was approved by the Outreach Commission, but that wouldn't have been possible if not for your gifts and commitment to the mission of St. Michael's. We might feel frustrated during this pandemic because it's more difficult to be physically doing mission, but that doesn't mean we're not doing God's work in the world. Your donations are empowering others to take action, and that is truly extravagant and generous.


