We all go through tough times in life. Times that are turbulent and unsettling. In the midst of these challenging seasons, it can be extremely helpful to have someone come alongside us to give understanding and encouragement—to provide stability, hope, and a caring heart to help us through the storm.

That is what a Stephen Minister is able to provide: a listening ear, a supportive perspective, and God's Word to help us through the challenges of life.

At St. Michael's, we have compassionate individuals who are trained to help us when we encounter loss, grief, relationship challenges, and a myriad of things that can throw our lives into a tailspin. Most recently, things such as the pandemic, the election, hurricanes, and wildfires.

Stephen Ministers are not counselors. They are not "know-it-alls." They are not individuals who try to fix everyone's troubles. They simply provide love, care, and support when we need it most. Stephen Ministers are caring individuals who can help us navigate our present situation.

Please note that you do not have to be a member of St. Michael's to have a Stephen Minister from St. Michael's. We follow CDC and St. Michael's COVID guidelines; we meet our care receivers by phone, Zoom, and other platforms consistent with the guidelines being mindful of safety for all.
