



SMEC AND HANDS FOR HOPE 2020

In previous years, November meant a blurb in the Trumpet for a number of weeks inviting the parish's participation in El Buen Samaritano's Hands for Hope program. Essentially, every \$25 donated ensured that low-income families would have the makings for a Thanksgiving dinner. El Buen uses any surplus funds from the campaign to supplement their food pantry for the year. St. Michael's celebrated donations in a playful, incarnational way—feathers put in the two lovely crocheted turkeys crafted by parishioner Bunny Cowan to mark goals met. This year looks different, partly due to the pandemic, but mostly due to your extravagant generosity. Thanks to you, the Outreach Commission has over \$2000 to donate to Hands for Hope this year plus \$2500 for COVID relief, gifts no less incarnational and communal for the lack of turkeys and feathers in the narthex. St. Michael's Sunday morning adult book study group: The Seekers

Speaking of feathers in caps, Phyllis Blees shares a brief history of The Seekers as they approach their 29th year of gathering.

The St. Michael's Sunday morning adult book study group, affectionately calling themselves "the Seekers," formed circa 1992, is coming up on its 29th year of weekly classes. Its purpose is to be a standing adult class offered on Sunday mornings. Its goals are: fellowship; greater understanding of our religion and spirituality; a place to be "fed;" discourse—exchange views at mature level; provide a safe place to discuss—never judging; challenging material; tolerance and open mindedness—we are not forced to swallow anything; and to be a thriving small group; making St. Michael's a place not just of greeting but of invitation and welcome.

Father Robby Vickery led the class for its first 10 years, followed by associate rector, Lex Breckinridge; assisting priest, Scott Irvin; and on occasion, acolytes. To free up clergy for new member and enrichment classes, lay members began leading, thus expanding the rich offerings for adults. Early lay leaders were Sarah and Peter Mullarkey, Elizabeth Turner, Doug Falls, and eventually its current facilitator, Phyllis Blees.

The class covers a wide variety of literature and poetry, supplemented with music and guests, moving at a comfortable pace that allows it to accomplish its goals. Drop-ins are encouraged. A given reading will be supplemented for those who haven't had a chance to read ahead. Truly, the primary goal of the class is loving fellowship, which has been foremost in our thoughts during this time of COVID-19. For information contact: Phyllis.blees@gmail.com. 
COURTYARD EUCHARIST A spoken Rite I Eucharist that begins at **8:00** am. Seating is provided.
