Aromatherapy Play Dough Recipe

Ingredients

1 cup flour ½ cup salt

1 cup water 1 teaspoon cream of tarter

1 ½ tablespoons vegetable oil (or 1 tbsp vegetable oil + 1/2 tbs jojoba oil if you have it)

Food coloring (grapefruit= orange, lavender = purple or blue, eucalyptus = green)

½ teaspoon essential oil (3/4 tsp if grapefruit oil)

Instructions

- 1. Mix all ingredients together in a pot (except for food coloring and essential oils- add later)
- 2. Stir until combined. Add food coloring. Ensure it is mixed well (no flour clumps)
- 3. Cook over medium heat for about 30 seconds to a minute.
- 4. Add a 1/2-teaspoon of essential oil. Continue cooking, stirring constantly.
- 5. The dough will get clumpy and then start to pull away from the sides of the pan. Continue stirring and kneading with spatula. Once it pulls together in a ball, it's done. Take it out of the pan immediately.
- 6. Place the cooked dough on wax paper and knead a few times until smooth. Let cool.
- 7. Store the dough in an airtight container so it won't dry out. Storing in the fridge lasts longer.

*Note: Many essential oils have natural healing properties.
