CHECK-IN INSTRUCTIONS FOR ALL IN-PERSON WORSHIP SERVICES Heading to campus for in-person worship? Please text "SMEC" to 312-487-3550 each week and follow the text prompt; include your full name and the service you plan to attend. Check in at anytime, right up to the service. This allows us to contact folks easily and rapidly if we have a COVID-19 exposure and in case of weather issues. We certainly won't turn anyone away. 
NOT TOO LATE! TAKE HOME KITS FOR ADVENT We are celebrating Advent at home this year with a take-home
