Dear St. Michael's Family—

Advent is the season in which Christians of all ages, youth as well as adults, are encouraged to slow down as we await the celebration of Christ's birth and anticipate his return. Advent is also a great time to highlight St. Michael's own youth group—people who are in an advent of their own, growing and awaiting the coming of adulthood. The youth here participate in a number of activities just for them, such as EYC, Bible study, and serving as acolytes, and they also join in with other parishioners for outreach opportunities such as going to the Trinity Center. In addition, several take part in diocesan events such as Missionpalooza and the Happening. Our youth minister, Luis Rivas, shepherds these younglings, providing and coordinating these opportunities, working often with the other youth ministers in the Austin area to present formational and inclusive gatherings.

For example, on Saturday, December 14, in the midst of Advent, St. Michael's youth are invited to a Cozy Play and Thoughtfulness Day at Good Shepherd in the Tarrytown area. This will be a joint retreat with the vouth groups from other Episcopal churches the area, providing space for fun, prayer, coziness, and hot chocolate for our students. We will hold a series of prayer workshops to teach youth about enriching their prayer lives and about learning to connect with God in a meaningful and personal way.
