My Grandmother was in the Altar Guild and I remember going to the church to help her, and to make palm crosses. It is a wonderful way to serve God and the church.

I first started in Altar Guild at my church in NY. Barbara Rusling recruited me at St Michael's on Bee Cave Rd the 2nd Sunday we visited so I have been in altar guild for 32 years. The most meaningful and spirit filled experience I have had during Altar Guild was when I was putting the fair linen on the altar and Gena was playing the organ and I felt like I was dressing the bride. I love being alone in the sanctuary and setting up.

From Gail Reid (left):

I can walk into the nave and a hush falls over me like a veil. That sacredness of silence is God's invitation to me to be present with God. Altar Guild offers moments of serving like Martha and Mary, and both are special. I have served on an altar guild for about 40 years. I cherish the work and the relationships. I never thought I would be searching for clothes pins to keep the fair linen from blowing off the altar. The last few months have brought humor, creativeness, and joy as we have set the table for the Eucharistic feast in the courtyard. We have made memories to last a lifetime. Shivering at sunrise, hearing the chirp of a cardinal, being thanked for serving by clergy and staff are all gifts from God.

WORSHIP SERVICES All our in-person services follow COVID-19 precautions as outlined by the Diocese of Texas and the City of Austin.


