It has been my privilege to travel with Episcopal Relief and Development three times in the last few years and see firsthand how their projects are helping to heal a hurting world. Whether it's a rehabilitation hospital for children in Palestine, an orphanage in Bethlehem for Muslim children, a school for special needs children in the Azarq Refugee Camp in Jordan or a group of women in a Sri Lanka jungle making life better for themselves and their village through micro-loans, Episcopal Relief and Development is there
 helping either alone or partnering with others.


Through Gifts for Life, families are able to have chickens and other livestock to feed their families, then ultimately have enough to sell to others inside and outside their communities, greatly improving their quality of life. The women in Sri Lanka were excited to show us how they conducted their business meetings and how their loan system worked. We were the first foreigners to visit since they started the micro-loan program.
